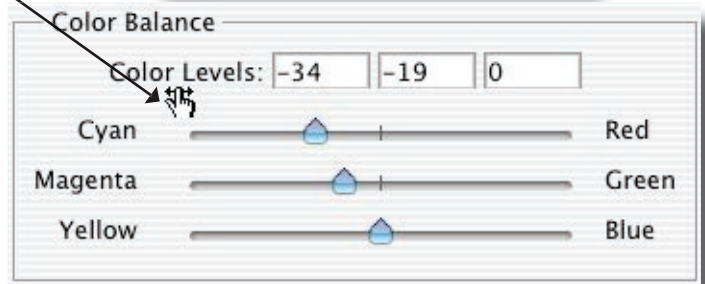
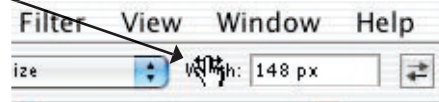
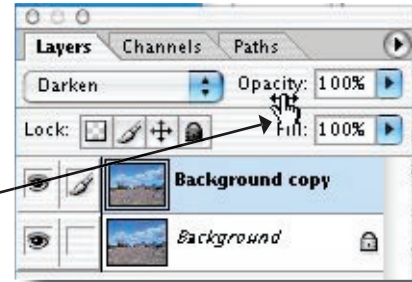
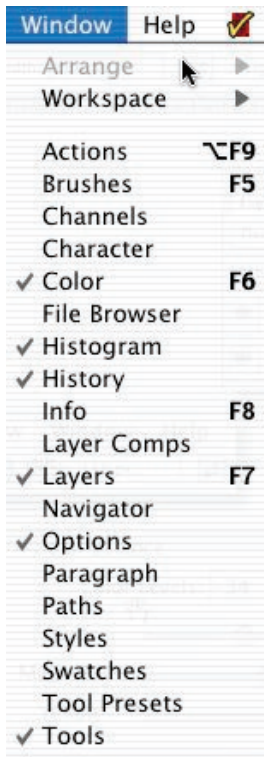


Photoshop CS Interface refinements.

Keep an eye out for “Scrubby Sliders” which work with various sliders in CS to alter values inside currently selected field. Tab to the next field and slide values higher or lower. TIP: Shiftkey produces a 10X increase.



Cursor will change to double arrow/hand icon when “Scrubby Sliders” are available.



Palettes are now listed alphabetically!

A new button in the tool options bar opens the brush palette (when brushes are selected).

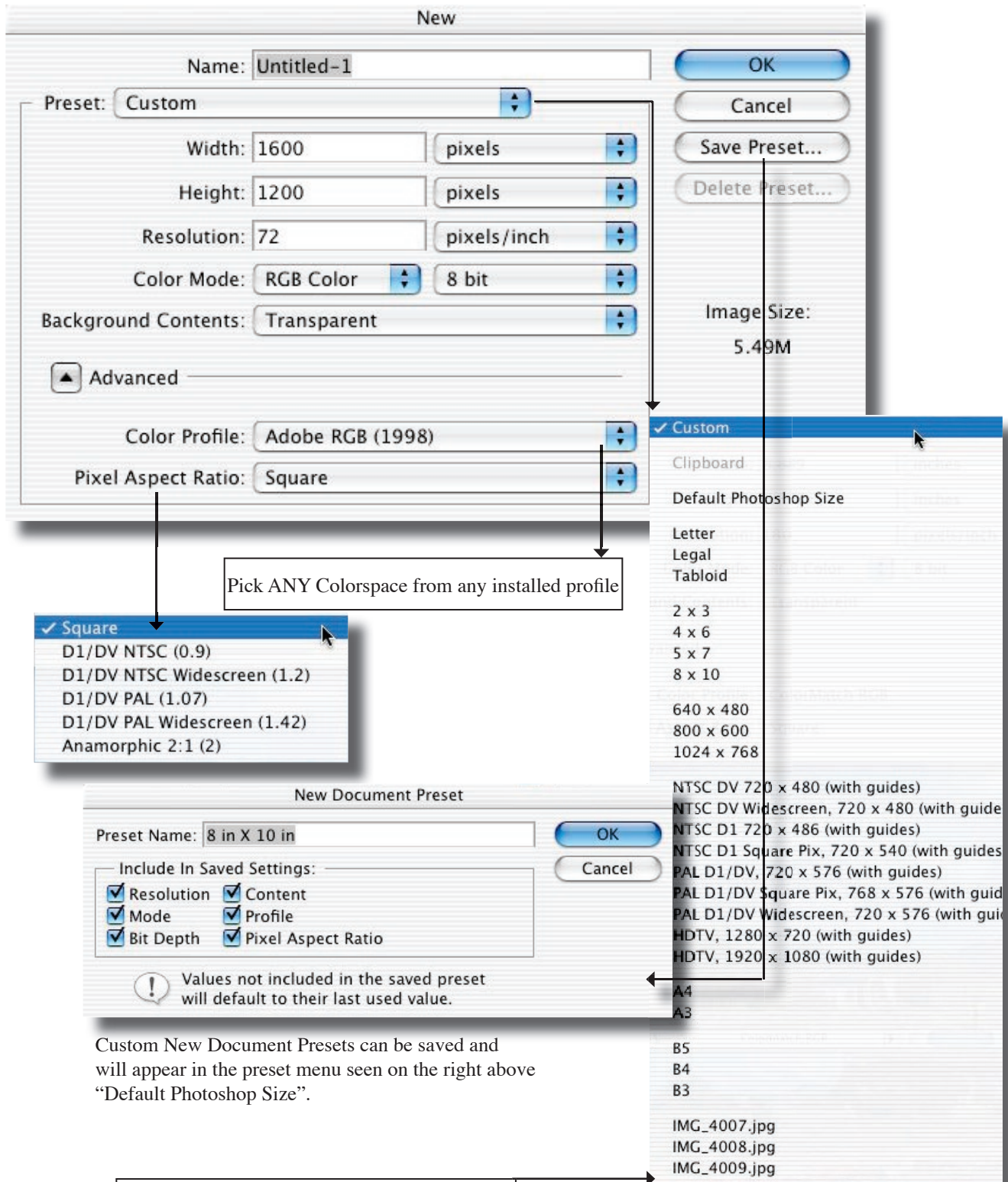


A new button in the tool options bar opens the File Browser or closes it.



New double arrows quickly swap entry data fields with a click!

Any open documents will show up here and can be used for picking a New Document size!

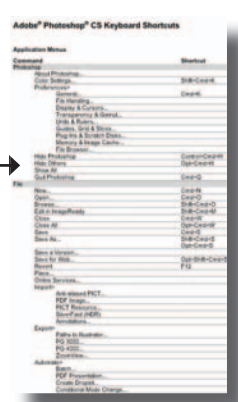
Keyboard Shortcuts.

Shortcuts can be for these items within Photoshop CS

Duplicate the current settings and then modify as a new set

Naturally multiple sets of keyboard shortcuts can be made, saved and shared among users (.kys file).

Clicking on this button creates an HTML file with every key command (along with filter info in Photoshop CS) and opens in a browser.



Keyboard Shortcut is pretty smart. Type in a character that is invalid and you get this warning.

A is an invalid shortcut. Menu commands must include ⌘ and/or an F-key in their shortcuts.

Enter a key command already used and this warning appears with very useful information and options!

⌘+B is already in use and will be removed from Image > Adjustments > Color Balance if accepted.

Accept and Go To Conflict Undo Changes
